Speaking and Listening - Syllabus for Entry Level

ENTRY LEVEL

Preparatory

1. Speak a poem of your own choice (max 6 lines)
2. Bring a special object to the exam and show the group, tell them three things about the object – (time limit 1 minute)
3. Participate in a group discussion using objects as a starting point

Introductory

1. Speak a poem of your own choice (max 8 lines)
2. Give a talk about your favourite animal – (time limit 1 minute)
3. Participate in a group discussion using the talks as a starting point

Preliminary

1. Speak a poem of your own choice (max 10 lines)
2. Give a talk about a special day – (time limit 2 minutes)
3. Read a prepared page from a book. (time limit 1 minute)
4. Participate in a group discussion using the talks as a starting point

Transition Level

1. Speak a poem of your own choice
2. Read a piece of prose from a book of your own choice. Introduce the book by telling us about why you particularly like the book. (time limit 1 minute)
3. Give a talk on the best present you have ever had (time limit 2 minutes)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group

4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group

Grade 2

1. Speak a poem of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 4 pages from a book of your own choice which includes dialogue, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud. Introduce the book by telling us which section of the book you like best. (time limit 2 minutes)
3. Give a talk on one of your hobbies. (time limit 2 minutes)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.

Grade 3 - Foundation Medal

1. Speak a poem of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 5 pages from any book by Michael Morpurgo which includes dialogue, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud. Introduce the book by explaining why you would recommend it (time limit 3 minutes)
3. Give a talk on something you have made or grown or discovered. (time limit 3 mins)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL 2

Grade 4

1. Speak a poem, song lyric or piece of prose of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 8 pages from a book by Malorie Blackman which includes dialogue, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud. Introduce the book by giving an outline of the plot (time limit 3 minutes)
3. Give a talk on a subject of your own choice. (time limit 3 minutes)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.

Grade 5

1. Speak a poem of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 8 pages from a book by Suzanne Collins or George R R Martin which includes dialogue, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud. Introduce the book by explaining how the prepared section fits into the overall story (time limit 3 minutes)
3. Give a talk on an organisation in which you are interested. (time limit 3 minutes)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.

Speaking and Listening - Syllabus for Level 3

ADVANCED LEVEL 3

Grade 6

1. Speak a poem by one of the War Poets of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 12 – 15 pages from a humorous book of your own choice which includes dialogue, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud.
3. Give a talk on either the Poem and Poet or book and author from your selection (time limit 4 mins)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.

Grade 7

1. Speak a poem by one of the Romantic Poets of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 12-15 pages from a 20th or 21st Century book of your own choice which includes dialogue, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud.
3. Give a talk on either the Poem and Poet or book and author from your selection (time limit 5 mins)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.

Grade 8

1. Speak a sonnet of your own choice
2. Prepare a reading of 12- 15 pages from a book of your own choice which includes dialogue from a different era from the sonnet chosen, the examiner will select a passage for you to read aloud.
3. Give a talk on either the Sonnet and Poet or book and author from your selection (time limit 5 mins)
4. Answer questions on and discuss the talk with the examiner and the group.
